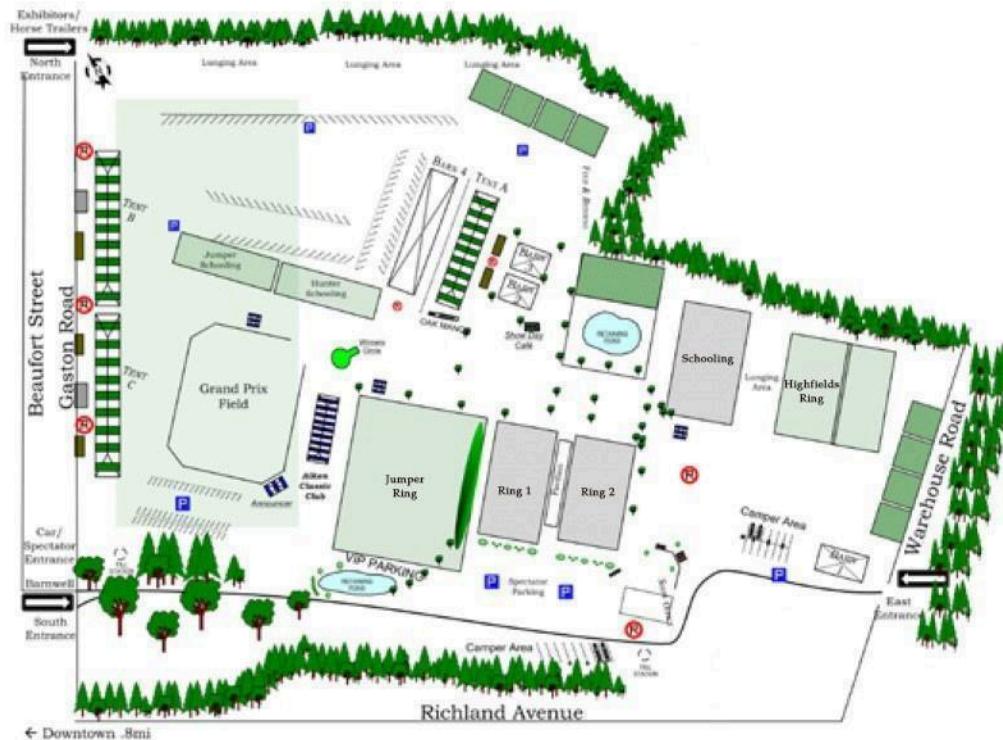

Show Eligibility

Classes and divisions are open to Thoroughbreds only. A “Thoroughbred” is a Thoroughbred that has been registered with The Jockey Club or a foreign Thoroughbred stud book recognized by The Jockey Club. All Thoroughbreds must have The Jockey Club Thoroughbred Incentive Program (T.I.P.) numbers on entry form. For more information and to register a Thoroughbred for a free T.I.P. number visit tjctip.com.

A prize will be awarded to the winner of each specialty award at the May 30 Exhibitor Welcome Party. To be eligible for specialty awards, horses' T.I.P. numbers must be submitted with entry.

Additionally, each New Vocations graduate will receive special recognition and a prize.

Specifications

NEW Stall Decorating Contest: Bring the Tropics to Aiken! Decorate your stall(s) so no one would know we're not competing on a Tropical Beach somewhere. Decorations will be evaluated and a winner will be chosen Saturday, May 31, in the afternoon. Winners receive bragging rights and goodies for you & your horse(s)! Creativity is highly encouraged, but please remember these basic considerations and have fun:

- No permanent decorations (paint, etc)
- Decorations must be fixed so they're not flying around haphazardly or loosely
- Exhibitors are in charge of bringing, maintaining, & removing decorations
- Decorations must be removed by 11:30 AM, Sunday, June 1. Otherwise, a \$50 fee will be added.

Entry Classifications:

- **Junior (Jr)** — Junior classes and divisions are open to riders 18 years of age and under as of 12/1/24.
- **Adult Amateur (AA)** — Open to Adult Amateurs only. For details on what constitutes Amateur status, visit usef.org.
- **Open** — Open to any rider. NOTE: All Saturday Open Hunter classes do **not** count toward the overall division.

Hunter, Jumper, Equitation, English & Western Pleasure

Special (2'6"), Suitable (2'9") and Low (3'0") Hunters

Hunter Divisions consist of three classes: two over fences and one under saddle. See the class list for rings/days for each division. Note the Saturday Open Hunter classes are **not** part of the division. The Jr and AA Divisions over-fences classes and Derbies may run concurrently at the same height, open card.

Horse & Rider combinations may enter 2 consecutive divisions. Horses are limited to seven (7) over fences classes per day, regardless of discipline or rider. Warm-up classes and hunter hack classes do not count toward daily maximum of over-fences classes. *Total number of classes per day per horse may be limited at the discretion of the judge or Show Management.*

Special Hunter Divisions — Horse & Rider combination may cross-enter in Beginning Hunter Division or Suitable Hunter Division. Fence height 2'6".

Suitable Hunter Divisions — Horse & Rider combination may cross-enter in Special Hunter Division or Low Hunter Division. Fence height 2'9".

Low Hunter Divisions — Horse & Rider combination may cross-enter in Suitable Hunter Division. Fence height 3'0".

Hunter Derbies Offered at 2'6", 2'9" and 3'0". Two-round format with the first round to be a typical hunter classic course with two (2) higher option fences and the second round to include "handy"-type questions. Both scores will be combined to determine placings. The Derbies will be offered using three fence heights but will be pinned as one class (Jr/AA and Open). Questions may include, but are not limited to, halt on course, trot fence, roll back, negotiating natural obstacles, etc. Cannot cross-enter Hunter Derby Divisions (must declare either Open or Jr/AA). Riders may ride more than one horse in the Derby but may not ride more than one per fence height. Ribbons 1st through 10th. Payouts: \$225, \$125, \$75, \$50, \$25

- **Junior/Amateur Hunter Derby** — Open to Thoroughbreds ridden by a Junior (under 18 as of 12/1/24) or Amateur who has shown in at least two (2) over fences hunter or equitation classes at the show (warm-up classes included). Exhibitor's fence height to be determined by the highest division competed in as horse-and-rider combination on Friday or Saturday. Riders must be entered in the class no later than 12 p.m. on Saturday, May 31.
- **Open Hunter Derby** — Open to Thoroughbreds and riders who have shown in at least two (2) over-fences hunter or equitation classes at the show (warmup classes included). Exhibitor's fence height to be determined by the highest division competed in as horse-and-rider combination on Friday or Saturday. Riders must be entered in the class no later than 2 p.m. on Friday, May 30.

Ground Poles, Crossrail Hunters, Very Green Hunters (2'0"), Beginner Hunters (2'3") and Equitation

Hunter Divisions consist of three classes. Equitation classes are stand alone and not a division. See the class list for rings/days for each division. The Junior and AA divisions over-fences classes may run concurrently at the same height, open card.

Ground Poles — Open to any Junior or Adult Amateur rider who has never shown at a canter over a course of fences 2' or higher. This is a walk trot class, cantering is not permitted unless competing in the W/T/C Ground Poles division. Rider is not permitted to cross enter in any jumping classes above Crossrails.

Crossrails Divisions — Trotting is permissible. Riders not eligible to jump over 2'3". Fence height 18".

Very Green Hunter Divisions — Horse & rider combination may not show 2'6" or higher. Trotting is permissible. No oxers, no combinations. Fence height 2'0".

Beginning Hunter Divisions — Horse & rider combination may not show 2'9" or higher. Fence height 2'3".

Mini Classic — Riders must have shown in at least two (2) over-fences hunter or equitation classes at the show (warm-up classes included). Exhibitor's fence height to be determined by the highest division

competed in as a horse-and-rider combination on Friday or Saturday. Riders may ride more than one horse in the Mini Classic but may not ride more than one per fence height. The class is a two-round format. The top 15 scores will return for a second round; final placings will be determined by the culmination of both scores. The class will be conducted using three fence heights, but it will be pinned as one class. The class is based on performance, hunter pace, jumping style, quality, substance and movement. Fence heights: crossrails, 2'0" and 2'3".

Jr/AA Crossrails Equitation — Open to any Junior or Adult Amateur rider who has never shown at a canter over a course of fences 2'3" or higher. Riders must ride a Thoroughbred. Trotting is not penalized. Canter is permitted on the flat in small groups of 5 or less. Fence height: 18". Riders not eligible to jump over 2'0".

Jr/AA 2'0" Equitation — Open to Junior and Adult Amateur riders on a Thoroughbred. Riders not eligible to jump over 2'0". Fence height 2'0".

Jr/AA 2'3" Equitation — Open to Junior and Adult Amateur riders on a Thoroughbred. Riders not eligible to jump over 2'3". Fence height 2'3".

Jr/AA 2'6" Equitation — Open to any Junior or Adult Amateur rider on a Thoroughbred. Riders not eligible to jump over 2'6". Fence height 2'6".

Jr/AA 2'9" Equitation — Open to any Junior or Adult Amateur rider on a Thoroughbred. Riders not eligible to jump over 2'9". Fence height 2'9".

Jr/AA 3' Equitation — Open to any Junior or Adult Amateur rider on a Thoroughbred. Fence height 3'.

Halter, Pleasure and Western

W/T English Pleasure — Open to any rider not competing above Crossrails Division. Horse to be shown both ways of the ring at the walk and trot. Judged on the English horse's way of going and manners at the walk and trot.

W/T/C English Pleasure — Open to any rider to be shown both ways of the ring at the walk, trot and canter. Judged on the English horse's way of going and manners at the walk, trot and canter.

W/T Equitation — Open to any rider not competing above Crossrails Division to be shown both ways of the ring at the walk and trot. Judged on the rider's position and ability to use correct and effective aids.

W/T/C Equitation — Open to any rider to be shown both ways of the ring at the walk, trot and canter. Judged on the rider's position and ability to use correct and effective aids.

W/J Western — Open to any rider not competing above Crossrails Division. To be shown both ways of the ring at the walk and jog. May be asked to back per judge's discretion. Judged on the Western horse's way of going and manners at the walk, jog, and lope. Riders may ride one- or two-handed on any bridle. Western tack is required. ASTM/SEI approved helmets must be worn by Junior riders. Western headgear permitted on adults over the age of 18 only. Protective headgear may be worn without penalty by adults over the age of 18.

W/J/L Western — Open to any rider riding a Thoroughbred to be shown both ways of the ring at the walk, jog, and lope. May be asked to back per judge's discretion. Judged on the Western horse's way of going and manners at the walk, jog, and lope. Riders may ride one- or two-handed on any bridle. Western tack is required. ASTM/SEI approved helmets must be worn by Junior riders. Western headgear permitted on adults over the age of 18 only. Protective headgear may be worn without penalty by adults over the age of 18.

In-Hand and Special Flats

Leadline — Open to children 6 years of age and under. Riders will be judged on horsemanship, hands, seat, legs and position.

Adult Leadline — Open to adults 18 years of age and older. Riders will be judged on horsemanship, hands, seat, legs and position.

Egg and Spoon — Open to any rider & horse combination that has shown in a walk/trot/canter, walk/jog/lope, or jumping class. Riders will be judged on ability to balance an egg on a spoon while riding a Thoroughbred in English or Western tack. Riders may be asked to walk, trot, canter, halt, or change direction. Last egg on a spoon wins! Eggs & spoons provided. NV reserves the right to excuse any riders deemed unsafe or not in control.

Ride A Buck — Open to any rider & horse combination that has shown in a walk/trot/canter, walk/jog/lope, or jumping class. Riders will be judged on ability to hold a \$5 bill under their thigh while riding in Western or English tack. Riders may be asked to walk, trot, canter, halt, or change direction. Riders may be asked to move \$5 bill to the knee or calf as a tiebreaker. \$5 bills **not** provided. Last rider with \$5 bill wins, winner takes all \$5 bills! NV reserves the right to excuse any riders deemed unsafe or not in control.

Fresh Off-The-Track In-Hand — Open to Thoroughbreds that raced or had a published work on or after Sept. 1, 2024. Horses will be judged on conformation and way of going at a walk and trot in hand. The date of placed horses' last starts or published works will be announced. Old racing blemishes and faults not considered. Horses should be presented in a bridle.

War Horse In-Hand (>50 Starts) — Open to Thoroughbreds that have raced at least 50 times in their racing career. Horses will be judged on conformation and way of going at a walk and trot in hand. Placed horse's statistics will be announced. Old racing blemishes and faults not considered. Horse should be presented in a bridle.

War Horse In-Hand (>\$100K Earned) — Open to Thoroughbreds that have earned at least \$100,000 in their racing career. Horses will be judged on conformation and way of going at a walk and trot in hand. Placed horse's statistics will be announced. Old racing blemishes and faults not considered. Horse should be presented in a bridle.

In-Hand Mares — Open to Thoroughbred mares. Mares will be asked to walk and trot. Judged on conformation and way of going. Old racing blemishes and faults not considered. Horse should be presented in a bridle.

In-Hand Geldings — Open to Thoroughbred geldings. Geldings will be asked to walk and trot. Judged on conformation and way of going. Old racing blemishes and faults not considered. Horse should be presented in a bridle.

Adopted Horse In-Hand — Open to Thoroughbreds adopted through an adoption program at some point. Proof of adoption is required. Horses will be asked to walk and trot/jog and will be judged on conformation and way of going. Old racing blemishes and faults not considered. Horse should be presented in a bridle or Western halter.

Western-Type Halter — Open to any Thoroughbred. Horses will be asked to walk and jog and will be judged on conformation and way of going as a Western-type horse. Old racing blemishes and faults not considered. Horse should be presented in a halter.

In-Hand Invitational Championship — Open to the winners of any In-Hand classes. Horses will be asked to walk and trot/jog. Judged on conformation and way of going. Old racing blemishes and faults not considered. Horse should be presented in a bridle or Western halter.

War Horse Pleasure W/T or W/J — Open to Thoroughbreds that have raced at least 50 times and/or earned more than \$100,000 in their racing career. To be judged on way of going at a walk and trot under English tack or walk and jog under Western tack. Horses can cross-enter into other Pleasure classes.

War Horse Pleasure W/T/C or W/J/L — Open to Thoroughbreds that have raced at least 50 times and/or earned more than \$100,000 in their racing career. To be judged on way of going at a walk, trot and canter under English tack or walk, jog, lope under Western tack. Horses can cross-enter into other Pleasure classes.

Adopted Horse Pleasure W/T/C or W/J/L — Open to Thoroughbreds adopted through an adoption program at some point. Proof of adoption is required. To be judged on way of going at a walk, trot and canter under English tack or walk, jog, lope under Western tack. Horses can cross-enter into other Pleasure classes.

Fresh Off-The-Track W/T or W/J — Open to Thoroughbreds that raced or had a published work on or after Sept. 1, 2024. To be judged on way of going at a walk and trot under English tack or walk and jog under Western tack. Horses can cross-enter into other Pleasure and Fresh Off-The-Track classes, but horses may not be cross-entered in jumping divisions exceeding 2'.

Fresh Off-The-Track W/T/C or W/J/L — Open to Thoroughbreds that raced or had a published work on or after Sept. 1, 2024. To be judged on way of going at a walk, trot and canter under English tack or walk, jog, lope under Western tack. Horses can cross-enter into other Pleasure and Fresh Off-The-Track classes, but horses may not be cross-entered in jumping divisions exceeding 2'.

Very Green (2'), Green (2'3"), Hopeful (2'6"), Suitable (2'9"), Schooling (3'0"), Training (3'3") and Open (3'6") Jumpers

Jumper Divisions consist of three classes. See the class list for rings/days for each division. Jr and AA over-fences classes and Stakes may run concurrently at the same height, open card. Horses are limited to seven (7) over-fences classes per day, regardless of discipline or rider. Warm-up classes and hunter hack classes do not count toward daily maximum of over-fences classes. Total number of classes per day per horse may be limited at the discretion of the judge or Show Management.

- **Open Jumper Division** — Open to all Thoroughbreds. Fence height 3'6".
- **Training Jumper Divisions** — Open to all Thoroughbreds. Fence height 3'3".
- **Schooling Jumper Divisions** — Open to all Thoroughbreds. Fence height 3'0".
- **Suitable Jumper Divisions** — Open to all Thoroughbreds. Horses may not enter into any class where fences are 3'3" or higher. Fence height 2'9".
- **Hopeful Jumper Divisions** — Open to all Thoroughbreds. Horses may not enter into any class where fences are 3'0" or higher. Fence height 2'6".
- **Green Jumper** — Open to all Thoroughbreds. Horses may not enter into any class where fences are 2'9" or higher. Fence height 2'3". Green Jumpers will be scored based on an optimum time; the closest to the time, over or under, will be used in tiebreakers for faults.
- **Very Green Jumper** — Open to all Thoroughbreds. Horses may not enter into any class where fences are 2'6" or higher. Fence height 2'0". No oxers, no combinations. Very Green Jumpers will be scored based on an optimum time; the closest to the time, over or under, will be used in tiebreakers for faults.

Mini Jumper Stake Open — Open to Thoroughbreds and riders who have shown in at least two (2) jumper classes on Friday or Saturday. Exhibitor's fence height to be determined by the highest division competed in as a horse-and-rider combination on Friday or Saturday. Riders may ride more than one horse in the Mini Jumper Stake but may not ride more than one per fence height. Horses jumping 2'0"

may not jump 2'6" or higher. Horses jumping 2'3" may not jump 2'9" or higher. Fence heights: 2'0", 2'3". If the rider is clear in their first round, they stay in the ring to complete the jumpoff.

\$500 Low Jumper Stake Junior/Amateur — Open to Thoroughbreds ridden by a Junior (under 18 as of 12/1/24) or Amateur rider who has shown in at least two (2) jumper classes on Friday or Saturday. Exhibitor's fence height to be determined by the highest jumper division competed in on Friday or Saturday. Horses jumping 2'6" may not jump 3'0" or higher. Horses jumping 2'9" may not jump 3'3" or higher. Fence heights: 2'6", 2'9". If the rider is clear in the first round, they stay in the ring to complete the jumpoff. Cannot cross-enter Low Jumper Stake divisions. Riders may ride more than one horse in the Low Jumper Stake but may not ride more than one horse per fence height. Riders must be entered in the class no later than 12 p.m. on Saturday, May 31. Ribbons 1st through 10th. Payouts: \$225, \$125, \$75, \$50, \$25

\$500 Low Jumper Stake Open — Open to Thoroughbreds and riders who have shown in at least two (2) jumper classes on Friday or Saturday. Exhibitor's fence height to be determined by the highest jumper division competed in on Friday or Saturday. Horses jumping 2'6" may not jump 3'0" or higher. Horses jumping 2'9" may not jump 3'3" or higher. Fence heights: 2'6", 2'9". If the rider is clear in the first round, they stay in the ring to complete the jumpoff. Cannot cross-enter Low Jumper Stake divisions. Riders may ride more than one horse in the Low Jumper Stake but may not ride more than one horse per fence height. Riders must be entered in the class no later than 12 p.m. on Saturday, May 31. Ribbons 1st through 10th. Payouts: \$225, \$125, \$75, \$50, \$25

\$500 Jumper Stake Junior/Amateur — Open to Thoroughbreds ridden by a Junior (under 18 as of 12/1/23) or Amateur rider who has shown in at least two (2) jumper classes on Friday or Saturday. Fence heights: 3'0", 3'3" and 3'6". If the rider is clear in the first round, they stay in the ring to complete the jumpoff. Cannot cross-enter Jumper Stake divisions. Riders may ride more than one horse in the Stake but may not ride more than one horse per fence height. Riders must be entered in the class no later than 12 p.m. on Saturday, May 31. Ribbons 1st through 10th. Payouts: \$225, \$125, \$75, \$50, \$25

\$500 Jumper Stake Open — Open to Thoroughbreds and riders who have shown in at least two (2) jumper classes on Friday or Saturday. Fence heights: 3'0", 3'3" and 3'6". A clean round will return for jump-off. Cannot cross-enter Jumper Stake divisions. Riders may ride more than one horse in the Stake but may not ride more than one horse per fence height. Riders must be entered in the class no later than 12 p.m. on Saturday, May 31. Ribbons 1st through 10th. Payouts: \$225, \$125, \$75, \$50, \$25

Dressage and Combined Test Classes

Classes may be split and/or combined based on entries. Some dressage classes may be held Saturday morning if entries warrant. This decision will be made closer to the event date. Combined test classes will be held Friday morning, followed by the stadium round. All classes are run under the current rules and regulations of USEF, as the overall governing body. Dressage only classes follow USDF & WDAA guidelines and Combined Test classes follow USEA guidelines.

Show Information

Attire Jackets will be worn for the hunter, dressage and equitation classes in the show rings. Riders will be allowed to show in tucked-in polo shirts in the jumper ring. Inclement weather may affect attire requirements.

Dogs All dogs must be under control at all times while on the show grounds. Unrestrained dogs create a serious safety hazard for exhibitors and their horses. Loose dogs will not be tolerated in the show ring area. They will be impounded, and the owner will be charged a \$100 fine added to their entry fee which will be donated to the SPCA.

Electrical and Fire Regulations All electrical installations and connections must meet all state and county codes. Aisles shall be maintained clear for a minimum of six (6) feet wide by eight (8) feet high. No obstructions or projections shall be allowed in these aisles. No Class I flammable liquids, such as gasoline, are allowed inside the buildings. Cooking is not permitted within any stable area. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to dismissal from further participation in the horse show without recourse.

Farrier, Veterinarian and Photographer No farrier, veterinarian or photographer other than those contracted with the official competition will be permitted to practice on the grounds without express permission of the management. Exhibitors wishing to use another farrier, veterinarian, or photographer must request a permit at the show office.

Food Food service will be available on the grounds beginning the first day of the show through Sunday.

Lunging No lunging permitted in the show rings. Lunging is permitted only in designated marked areas.

Minor Exhibitors Parent(s) or guardian(s) of a minor child shall hold the horse show management and the facility harmless for any injury to such minor. No minor child's entry will be accepted or number issued unless entry is signed by a parent or legal guardian. Signatures of unrelated persons will not be accepted.

Motorized Vehicles and Golf Carts Unlicensed drivers are not permitted to operate any motorized vehicles, ATVs, motorcycles, golf carts, etc., on the show grounds. Failure to abide by these regulations will subject the exhibitor to suspension from the horse show.

Parking Fire regulations prohibit all vehicles, including trailers, vans and campers from being parked in the stable areas. Vans and trailers will be allowed in the stable area only to load or unload. PARKING AREAS WILL BE DESIGNATED. VIOLATORS WILL BE TOWED AWAY AT OWNER'S EXPENSE AND FINED \$100.

Poling and Offsets Manual poling and use of bamboo offsets or any excessive force are prohibited for all horses competing. Any rider, trainer, groom, or any other person who is in violation of the rules set forth above will be fined \$500 for each incident and may be suspended from further competition for the duration of the scheduled competition starting from the time of the incident. Any horse upon which a violation of the manual poling and/or use of bamboo offsets rules is perpetrated will be suspended from competition for the duration of the scheduled competition. All entry fees for the classes entered during the suspended period of the horse in question will be forfeited.

Prize Money The owner of any horse or pony exhibited in classes where prize money is awarded must provide a social security number or federal identification number on the entry. Foreign exhibitors must fill out a W-8EC1 or W-8BEN form prior to receiving any winnings. Prize money may be applied as a credit on your account at the show office. Checks may be mailed within 30 days after the show.

Protective Headgear Everyone must wear properly fitting ASTM/SEI-approved protective headgear with harness secured and properly fitted while riding in the designated schooling and exercise areas, the show ring and while jumping anywhere on the show grounds. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or guardian or trainer of junior exhibitors, to ensure that headgear complies with appropriate safety standards and is properly fitted and in good condition.

RV Hookups RV hookups are available on a first-come, first-served basis. See entry blank for information on securing a RV hookup. No nightly rates.

Schooling Schooling in the show rings without permission is prohibited at all times. \$100 fine for anyone caught in the rings before or after the show if rings have been closed. Some rings will be available for schooling after the show each day. Closing times will be announced each day. The rings

will be available in the mornings until 30 minutes before start time. Management may restrict schooling in any ring if conditions warrant.

Horse Welfare Horses may not enter more than seven (7) over-fences classes per day, including equitation and all special classes. The total number of classes per day, per horse may be limited at the discretion of the judge or show management.

Entries Entries will only be accepted at horseshowsonline.com. Numbers will not be issued without a credit card logged with the horse show secretary. The entry form must include:

- Horses' names and complete descriptions;
- All classes or divisions entered;
- Organization membership numbers, if applicable; **(TIP numbers required)**
- The owner's social security or federal identification number; and • All mandatory signatures, including legal guardian for minors.

Stabling Stall reservations must be guaranteed with a check or credit card. Stabling will be available the day before the show. Stalls are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Reserve stalls early by calling 803-649-3505 or emailing psjshows87@gmail.com. Stall fees are non-refundable after the stall closing date.

Check Out Any horse show bills not checked out at the conclusion of each show will be assessed a \$25 fee. Any mistakes at checkout must be resolved within 24 hours. Check your bills carefully.

Show Office Hours

- Competition Days — Opens one hour before the start of the first class and closes 30 minutes following the last class.
- Non-Competition Days — 12 p.m. to 5 p.m.

Damage All owners and exhibitors shall be held responsible for any damage incurred by them, their agents or employees to stalls, buildings, and other properties on the show grounds, and shall be billed accordingly. (This includes screw eyes or nails in stalls.)

Day Exhibitors/Non-Stabled Horses Horses entered but not stabled must use the designated area for day exhibitors. There is a \$30 trailer-in fee per horse per day and a \$25 service fee per horse per show.

Feed and Bedding Hay, grain and bedding may be purchased on the grounds. For same-day delivery, orders must be received prior to 12 p.m. No Sunday deliveries. For feed and bedding reservations prior to arrival, please call 803-649-3505 or e-mail psjshows87@gmail.com. Deliveries other than those made through the horse show office are not permitted. You may bring your own.

Non-Negotiable Checks Checks returned by the bank for any reason will be assessed a penalty of \$30 or 10% of the check amount, whichever is greater. Upon notification of a returned check, accounts will be given three (3) days to make full payment, including the penalty, which must be paid in certified funds, cashier's check or money order. Overnight mail service is advised in order to avoid notification of the sanctioning organizations for disciplinary action.

Non-Showing Horses All non-showing horses must have a signed entry blank in the office, \$50 non-showing fee per horse per weekend.

Office Fee All horses, showing or non-showing, will be assessed a \$25 fee. This fee allows the horse unlimited adds and scratches from classes and, access to schooling areas and rings at designated time, and it defers all charges for parking passes.

EMT Fee All horses, showing or non-showing, will be assessed a \$10 fee. This allows us to fairly compensate our EMT for all necessary needs throughout the show.

Refunds Full refunds will be given before the closing date of the stalls. After the closing date of stalls, stall fees are not refundable. After the show starts, with the official vet's certificate only, full refund will be given minus the stabling fee and a \$25 scratch fee and fees for classes already held prior to notification of horse show secretary, whether exhibited or not. Scratches must be made in the horse show office on the official form. Refunds will be mailed within 30 days after the horse show.

Splitting Tack Stalls The show office will split the tack stalls, per a trainer's instructions, among his or her clients until Saturday at 12 p.m. At that point, the total amount will be billed to the trainer's barn account.

Scratch Fee There is a \$25 scratch fee for cancellations after the start of the show.

Canadian Exhibitors The legend "U.S. Funds" must be pre-printed on the face of all Canadian checks drawn on Canadian banks used to pay entry fees.

Adds and Scratches No slip, no trip. You must enter your classes by 5 p.m. the day prior to showing to ensure the daily agenda can be as accurate as possible. If you are not on the class sheet, you must add in the show office and bring the slip to the in-gate. If you are scratching, you must also do this in the show office and bring your slip to the ingate. No adds on Sunday.

Rules and Regulations

The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations or PSJ Rules listed on our website shall be decided by the Horse Show Management; its decision to be final. The Horse Show Management reserve to itself the right to limit entries in any class, section or division, to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without any claim for damages; to change any course, to add a dotted line, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges, to change specifications in jumper classes as competitions warrants.

ADDITIONAL TERMS AND DEFINITIONS OF THE RELEASE OF LIABILITY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK, WAIVER AND INDEMNIFICATION In consideration for entry upon the SHOW GROUND FACILITIES of the COMPETITION, the undersigned on behalf of myself, my trainers, instructors, coaches, clients, agents, employees, grooms, invitees, representatives, assigns, executors, heirs, independent contractors (including but not limited to veterinarians, farriers, masseuse, chiropractor, therapists, braiders, shippers), and, if applicable, on behalf of my minor child or children (hereinafter collectively referred to as "I") agrees: Rules and Regulations Rules and Regulations I agree that COMPETITION as used in this entry blank, in the prize list and in the USEF rules means the Horse Show, each and every class and/or event conducted and ALL ACTIVITIES that I undertake AT ANY TIME and for any purpose upon entry of the SHOW GROUND FACILITIES including any horse which is on the SHOW GROUND FACILITIES for my use, in my control or at my request. I further agree that COMPETITION includes the entire week of the horse show including the time horses and/or people are allowed to enter to set up, stable and/or conduct business whether its expressly and/or specifically related to the horse show and classes being conducted/ held that week through and including the time all horses and/or people vacate the SHOW GROUND FACILITIES. I agree that this Release of Liability includes any horse that I have asked to come onto the SHOW GROUND FACILITIES for any purpose, and/or is in my control and/or custody and regardless whether the horse is being stabled at the SHOW GROUND FACILITIES and/or competing in the COMPETITION. I agree that "RELEASED PARTIES" means the "Competition" known as the Progressive Show Jumping Horse Show, the "Horse Show Management" and/or "Competition Management" as referenced in the prize list, the Federation Licensee, Highfields, LLC, Highfields Event Center and each of their officers, directors, managers, members, owners, shareholders, employees, representatives, agents, subsidiaries, volunteers, officials, affiliated and associated persons, companies and organizations, assigns and entities or organizations

as may now or hereafter be constituted, that own, are related to or manage the property owned by such entities. I agree that SHOW GROUND FACILITIES means Highfields Event Center including but not limited to all improvements, structures (permanent or temporary), buildings, tents, stalls, fixtures (including but not limited to all jumps and related equipment), arenas (and the footing therein) located on the premises and/or provided by RELEASED PARTIES during the COMPETITION. I agree that if I am not a member of the Federation that I will abide by all rules and regulations of the Federation. I agree that the Rules of the Prize List are incorporated as if set forth herein. Release and Waiver of Claims: I hereby fully and forever release, waive and discharge the RELEASED PARTIES and each of them who are or might be liable in any way from any and all claims, demands, actions, causes of actions, liabilities of any kind which I may or might have against RELEASED PARTIES or any of them, arising from or by reason of any and all known and unknown, foreseen or unforeseen bodily and personal injuries, damage to property, injury to horse and any consequences thereof, which I may sustain due to the ordinary negligence of RELEASED PARTIES; I further agree that except for the gross negligence or willful misconduct of the RELEASED PARTIES, I SHALL NOT SUE or bring any legal action, claim, and/or demand against for any economic and noneconomic losses due to bodily injury, death, property damage and/or injury to any horse in relation to the SHOW GROUND FACILITIES and/or the operation and conduct of the COMPETITION. I agree this RELEASE INCLUDES ALL ACTIVITIES I PARTICIPATE IN AND ALL AREAS OF THE SHOW GROUND FACILITIES as defined above. This release also includes all activities I conduct at the SHOW GROUND FACILITIES and includes all times that I am at the SHOW GROUND FACILITIES no matter what the purpose and/or activity being undertaken. Hold Harmless: I hereby agree to defend, indemnify and hold harmless RELEASED PARTIES from and against any and all claims, liabilities, loss, damages, demands, actions, causes of action, including attorneys' fees, cost and expenses of any kind, which may be made against them, or any of them, which arise out of the active or passive negligence of RELEASED PARTIES while either I or any horse at my request or in my control is/was on the SHOW GROUND FACILITIES and/or participating in the COMPETITION. I agree to defend RELEASED PARTIES, at my expense, regardless if RELEASED PARTIES are negligent or not. Assumption of Risk: I hereby acknowledge and assume the risk that equestrian activity, including jumping, is very dangerous and involves the risk of serious injury and/or death and/or property damage. I expressly acknowledge that injuries may be compounded or increased by negligent maintenance of the SHOW GROUND FACILITIES, faulty or improperly secured equipment, improper supervision or compliance with Federation rules and regulations. Acts of God and negligent rescue operations or procedures of RELEASED PARTIES and negligent handling of horses and independent operations by trainers, riders and/or boarders who use the SHOW GROUND FACILITIES or others who are not affiliated with RELEASED PARTIES. I acknowledge that horses can be injured while being ridden, groomed, stabled, walked and/or exercised and I expressly assume the risk of injury to any horse under my control and/or custody or on the SHOW GROUND FACILITIES at my request. This agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of South Carolina with respect to all RELEASED PARTIES, except for the Federation as set forth on page one. I agree this Release extends to all acts of ordinary negligence of RELEASED PARTIES and is intended to be as broad and inclusive as permitted by law. If any portion of this Release and/or Entry Blank is held invalid, it is agreed that the balance shall continue in full legal force and effect. I have not relied on any oral representations or statements made that are contrary to or modify the above Release or warnings. I agree that by signing the front page of this Entry Blank that I am bound by the Release, waiver and warnings contained herein and that both sides/pages constitute one incorporated agreement. I agree I have the express authority to sign this entry blank/Release on behalf of the owner and/or rider. While every effort has been made to avoid mistakes in this publication, the USEF, Progressive Show Jumping, Inc. and its management assume no liability to anyone for errors. Any significant errors or changes will be disclosed to competitors whose entries are accepted upon their acceptance, and otherwise in accordance with USEF rules.
